Kuester moved and Mcdonald seconded the approval of the meeting agenda with striking item #6 and with no conflicts of interest. No discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Smith moved and Lamp seconded action on the consent agenda consisting of approval of the minutes of the regular session held Monday, February 5, 2024. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Mayor Eberline recognized Mike Muller for his retirement from the City of Grundy Center after 27.5 years of service.

Lamp moved and Mcdonald seconded action on Resolution 2024-10, a resolution to approve the street closures for Felix Festival, July 11-13, 2024. Kuester questioned the parking spots in the 700 & 800 blocks of G Avenue and commented that the City does not have enough cones to cover all of those spots and all the side streets throughout town during the parade. Committee was encouraged to purchase some of their own. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Mcdonald moved and Rasmussen seconded action on Resolution 2024-11, a resolution to approve the hire for the Police Office position. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes. Mayor Eberline then introduced and swore in Jacob Oberle with the oath of service.

Smith moved and Rasmussen seconded action to enter into closed session at 6:42pm based on Chapter 21.5 (i) for discussion on application for potential hire. No discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Rasmussen moved and Mcdonald seconded action to close the closed session, reenter into regular session, and take necessary action at 7:11pm. No discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Rasmussen moved and Smith seconded action on Resolution 2024-12, a resolution to approve the hire for the Community Center Head Bartender/Co-Director position and set the wage. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Kuester moved and Smith seconded action on Resolution 2024-13, a resolution to set a public hearing for April 1, 2024, for the FY2025 proposed property tax levy. Sawyer explained this is public hearing is to discuss the highest levy the City can consider moving forward on the FY2025 annual budget. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes. Lamp left the meeting at 7:25pm.

Mayor Eberline opened the public forum at 7:21pm. Bob Greany, 1102 13th Street, expressed concerns about residents feeding feral cats throughout town. Rich Ahlberg, 407 G Avenue, commented on update from GCMU was expected. No further comments, public forum closed at 7:29pm.
